

## Supreme Court Rules House Arrest Legal in Bankruptcy Cases

The Supreme Court recently issued a judgment stating that the domiciliary arrest of the members of a company's board of directors is constitutional and does not affect the right of freedom of transit, as long as they leave a legal representative in charge and empowered to face all legal obligations the company subject to business reorganization might have.

Having fulfilled this prerequisite, which is at the discretion of the judge to decide, the members of the board of directors of a company in a business reorganization or bankruptcy proceeding and subject to domiciliary arrest are fully entitled to leave the country.
